CoC Program Competition: Funding the CoC

The CoC's Lead Agency has to the opportunity to renew our CoC Planning grant and our Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) grant.

CoC Program Competition: Funding Housing Programs

CoC Member Organizations have the opportunity to apply for grants to renew or create permanent housing programs.

Who can apply?

- Nonprofit organizations
- State and local governments
- Faith-based organizations
- Indian Tribes and Tribally Designated Housing Entities (TDHE)
- Public Housing Agencies

*All applicants must be designated by the Continuum of Care. **More information on eligibility requirements can be found in the 2023 NOFO (III.A and B) and in 24 CFR 578.15

What can I apply for?

- Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH)
- Rapid Rehousing (RRH)
- Transitional Housing (TH)
- Supportive Services Only (SSO)

Local Competition

Each Continuum must conduct their own local competition, designed by the CoC and led by the CoC's Lead Agency.

Priority Listing

The Rating and Ranking Committee is made up of one, non-CoC funded representative from each Chapter.

The score we receive as a CoC on our Collaborative Application determines whether our Tier 2 projects will be funded.

Reviewing Our 2023 Consolidated Application

Strengths of our 2023 Collaborative Application

Publicizing an open invitation to join the CoC, recruiting new member organizations, and spreading awareness about the CoC in the community. Our Coordinated Entry System has great geographic coverage and a great prioritization process. We work well with DV providers utilizing the comparable database.

Helping our clients increase their cash and non-cash income through employment and benefits. Helping our clients maintain their permanent housing or exit to another permanent housing destination.

Reviewing Our 2023 Consolidated Application

Areas for Improvement

HUD lists agencies they would like for us to collaborate with, and there's a few places where we fall short: Tribal Organizations, local jails, agencies that serve victims of human trafficking, and providers of early childhood services. (CES, Formal Agreements, etc.)

Soliciting and responding to opinions from the public and persons with lived experiencing of homelessness on our CoC operations. (CES, rating and ranking, etc.)

Certain training requirements: preventing the separation of families, implementation of the Equal Access Final Rule, implementation of the Gender Identity Final Rule.

Conducting a Racial Equity Analysis and establishing a correction plan with measurable outcomes.

CoC Bonus

The CoC Bonus allows Continuums of Care to request up to 7 percent of their Final Pro Rata Need (FPRN) to create one or more new projects. New projects must meet project eligibility and project quality threshold requirements.

Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault and Stalking Bonus (DV Bonus)

The DV Bonus allows Continuums of Care to request up to 10 percent of their FPRN to create one or more new projects that serve survivors of domestic violence.

Point in Time Count

SC STATE OF HOMELESSNESS REPORT 2020

- The Upstate Continuum of Care continues to hold the highest number of the homeless population in the state, 1,263, which is 35% of the total South Carolina homeless population, which is 3,608 of people experiencing homelessness.
- The SC 2020 State of Homelessness Report states that of the top 10 counties with the highest homeless population, 4 of the counties are in the Upstate Continuum of Care.
- Greenville #3, Anderson #5, Spartanburg #6 and Greenwood #9.

Point in Time Count

- On the last Wednesday in January, nationwide, there is the Homeless Point In Time (PIT) Count.
- Homeless service providers, law enforcement and volunteers, coordinate areas where the homeless reside - parks, encampments, soup kitchen, libraries, etc.
- As survey is done questioning the homeless individual/family, where they will be sleeping on that Wednesday night.
- The 2024 Point In Time count has a tentative date of January 24, 2024.

PIT Count Coordinators

Surveys are provided by HUD (Department of Housing and Urban Development) and distributed to the lead of the Continuum of Care (United Housing Connections) who then allocates to each PIT County/Chapter Coordinator.

Each county or Chapter has one coordinator who provides the recruitment and training of volunteers, agencies, shelters and law enforcement.

The coordinator is responsible for the training of the volunteers which includes review of the surveys, explanation of the PIT count as well as the locations, times and dates of the survey solicitation.
